"The Golden City" is lit by VICTOR LOCKWOOD who has designed the lighting for most of the Group's major productions. Formerly Stage Director at the Gulbenkian Theatre, Canterbury, he is now Chief Electrician with Scottish Opera. Recently he designed the lighting for their production of "The Magic Flute".

The Pavane is choreographed by STUART HOPPS the Assistant Director of Scottish Theatre Ballet. During the last year he formed a modern dance unit, Moveable Workshop, which appeared in "Columba" at the Traverse last December, and has since toured all over Scotland giving workshops and performances in schools, colleges and theatres.

The Director of Strathclyde Theatre Group is HUGO GIFFORD who trained for two years at the Drama Centre, London. His productions for the Group include six world premieres of works by Scottish authors such as George Mackay Brown, Tom Wright, Joan Ure and John Hall. In 1973 he directed the premiere of "The Seven Deadly Sins", a masque by Robert Nye and James Douglas, for the Stirling Festival; and also worked with Scottish Theatre Ballet Moveable Workshop. He is the Director of Drama at Strathclyde University.

Rehearsal and production photographs are by DAVID LAVINE, photographer to the Company, who used to be an advertising copywriter but now he lies no more. He drinks Blue Mountain coffee, dreams of becoming a St. Bernard, and, being a loyal American, voted against Nixon in 1972.
